### How Our Member Organizations Are Affected And How They Are Responding

# Amnesty International of Iowa https://www.amnestyusa.org

Because of the pandemic, our groups are not meeting in person. However, we continue to work on human rights issues by sending individual letters and postcards from our homes that address Urgent Action cases. Our Ames group focuses on the "disappeared" gentlemen in Pakistan. Cedar Rapids members write letters about the Palestinian community in the Occupied Territories. We also send and distribute postcards on women's human rights issues, including a women's rights activist in Iran and an imprisoned female opposition senator in the Phillippines. Other postcards request an additional series of federal actions to address kidnapping, sexual assault, disappearances and murders of native women. Amnesty International continues to monitor penal institutions in the United States and around the world, including detention centers and camps for asylum seekers and immigrants, with the

goal of limiting the spread of the COVID 19 virus in these settings

# Animal Lifeline of Iowa (ALI) www.animal-lifeline.com

ALI made the difficult decision on March 16 to close our Thrift Shop until further notice. The Thrift Shop provides a substantial revenue source for the lifesaving work being done at our special-needs, no-kill animal shelter. The revenue loss is significant. In addition, due to the pandemic can only accept urgent cases that require emergency procedures from ALI's veterinary partners. Most of ALI's volunteer task force is staying home, the staff to work harder than ever, increasing our already extensive disinfecting procedures, caring for the special needs animals at our facility and ensuring they still receive the care they require. ALI continues to process adoptions & accept donations by appointment only.

The COVID 19 virus is having a profound effect on the membership of CWJ. Most individuals lack sufficient income to support their families, the majority cannot apply to receive the unemployment insurance, and most will not receive the economic incentive to be distributed by the U.S. government. In addition, lack of health insurance increases the danger of getting sick and creates very high levels of fear. brations impossible, both in Iowa CWJ has initiated a contribution program through which community allies can donate their stimulus checks to our neighbors with the most urgent needs. Our goal is to pass along payments of \$400-\$600 per family to local community members in crisis, starting with those who are ineligible for any assistance. Distribution will be overseen by a formal committee,

and 100% of stimulus check donations will be distributed to families in need

But we help as we can, and we are actively writing grants requesting emergency funds so that we can provide additional assistance. We are particularly concerned about the potential of coronavirus infection amongst the immigrant and refugee populations, especially un-
