Our Member Organizations: They Continue to Work Through the Shutdown

Cedar Valley Habitat for Humanity Helps with Home-ownership

Driven by the vision that everyone needs a decent place to live, Habitat for Humanity began in 1976 as a grassroots effort on a community farm in Southern Georgia. The Christian housing organization has since grown to become a leading global nonprofit, working in nearly 1,400 communities throughout the U.S. and in more than 70 countries. Cedar Valley Habitat for Humanity, founded in 1988, has built or rehabilitated over 160 homes, serving 259 families locally to date. The organization typically works with families who

are at 30-55 percent of the area median income (AMI), families who would otherwise not be able to afford adequate housing.

Habitat partners with first-time homebuyers who are not able to qualify for conventional home loans, offering them an opportunity for a "hand-up" out of poverty. Families are qualified based on three main criteria: 1) need for simple, decent and affordable housing; 2) ability to pay back a zero-interest mortgage; and 3) willingness to partner with Habitat through sweat equity and a series of classes on a range of topics, including budgeting, effective use of credit, wills and insurance, basic home maintenance, lawn care, and being a good neighbor.

Johnson County Humane Society Works with Cats

Johnson County Humane Society continues to work in the community helping with trap-neuter-return of outdoor colony cats. In a recent project, five kittens were young enough to be removed from the situation, socialized and adopted. The four adults in the colony were neutered and vaccinated and returned to their home territory where a colony manager feeds them and monitors their health. With steady funding through donations to Iowa Shares, JCHS can help control the outdoor cat population and improve the lives of animals in our community.

Friends of the Marion Public Library

The Friends of the Marion Library is a volunteer organization that promotes the use of the library and funds programs that encourage literacy, such as the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, which mails free books to children under age 5, and Homebound Books which mails

library books to individuals who cannot leave their homes.

It has been quite a year for the Friends of the Library group and we have adjusted and learned to adapt. The pandemic closed the library temporarily and required us to close our used bookstore, a major source of funding for the group. Even as the library opened back up with limited in-person programming, the bookstore remained closed for the safety of our volunteers. Then, the derecho hit Marion hard in August. The library building suffered significant damage inside and out and could no longer be occupied. Approximately twenty percent of the library print collection was lost and the huge task of moving the remaining contents to a storage facility began. In September the library opened in a temporary storefront location in uptown Marion. On October 1, Marion broke ground on the new Marion Public Library, just across the street from the current building in the heart of Marion.

The Friends of the Library held two used book sales outdoors over the summer with precautions like masks, distancing and grab bags full of books. While those sales were successful, we missed our bookstore and its regular location. Also, we had had to stop accepting donated used books due to lack of storage space. We had boxes of books just begging for new homes! So, we adapted the undamaged lobby space in the old library location on 6th Avenue and will be holding used book sales on the first and third Saturdays of the month from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm, beginning October 17. With 600 Marion children signed up for the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, we need about \$15,000/year just to fund this program. We can't let the children of Marion down and we will find a way to continue to send each enrolled child a book every month directly to their homes until they turn age 5. Iowa Renewable Energy Assoc. Helps with Generators

Iowa Renewable Energy Association recently helped a local school with their pedal generators — which are bike pedals that create energy and can power lamps, etc. They also gave away thirteen cell phone solar chargers to help people without power following the Derecho. I-Renew continues to bring attention to sustainable living and renewable energy through their social media posts.

Center for Worker Justice

The Center for Worker Justice has become a lifeline for many eastern Iowa families. The COVID-19 crisis touches everyone – but tragically, local, state, and federal assistance programs often don't. Many low wage immigrants and refugees who contribute so much to our communities, through their labor, love, and leadership, have fallen prey to this plague. Many are not eligible for, cannot navigate, or

don't trust our complex government publication as guidance to the small sponsored assistance programs. and large ways we can all help to

That's where the CWJ initiative "From My Home to Yours" comes in. It blossomed in the wake of those stimulus checks so many in the community received earlier this year. For the more fortunate among us, these were not desperately needed. CWJ appealed to our members, allies, and friends to pass some of these stimulus funds along to community members needing help with the next rent check, the next meal, or the next family crisis.

Generous Iowans responded. Well over \$100,000 was raised. Over the past few months, most of those funds have been distributed to hundreds of needy families, some of them undocumented. The "From My Home to Yours" fund now needs to be replenished. The desperate conditions many face continues.

With the support of organized labor, faith communities, and neighbors like you, this initiative has already worked wonders. Thanks for caring.

Iowa Physicians for Social Responsibility

PSR Iowa started the year working closely with staff from the county conservation department, Iowa Valley Habitat, Coralville Parks and Rec. division, and many others to create an engaging public event encouraging everyone to "make every day earth day." Once COVID made that impossible, PSR pivoted to an online bi-monthly

publication as guidance to the small and large ways we can all help to make every day Earth Day for everyone. Each newsletter focuses on selected interrelated pertinent topics (COVID, Climate, Health, Food, Water) with informational and educational material for ways to act. PSR Iowa has also continued to educate and activate the public to support efforts to invest in people and not in deadly nuclear weapons!

Iowa United Nations Association

The Iowa UNA will host two exciting Zoom events in Oct and Nov. featuring speakers addressing the Sustainable Development Goals and ways immigration policies and enforcement affect the health of immigrant Iowa communities. The Iowa UNA along with PSR Iowa recently helped organize and promote a Peace Parade for the International Day of Peace, on Sept 21.

Quad Cities Alliance for Immigrants and **Refugees (QCAIR)**

This has been a challenging year for QCAIR. Our US Citizenship Outreach Program is significantly impacted by the pandemic. Face-to-face classes are now one-on-one distant instruction sessions. This change slows down our process, and strains our resources. We also distributed facemasks, lunch bags and other items to our immigrants, refugees and their families.

Many of our immigrants and refugees work at the meatpacking plants; in the past few months, some were tested positive for COVID-19, many laid off, some lost their jobs permanently. Many of them relied on the local food pantries to feed their families. QCAIR received a significant number of requests for assistance for rent, utilities, medicine, tuition, etc. We are grateful that, as far as we know, nobody from our immigrant and refugee communities was evicted from his/her home, or died of COVID-19. In June, World Relief, Open Door and QCAIR jointly administered the Illinois Department of Human Services COVID-19 Immigrant Family Support Project, and provided financial assistance to 60 Illinois Quad City families. Through the generosity of our local donors, OCAIR was able to establish a similar fund to benefit our Iowa immigrants and refugees. We continue to work with IDPHS to implement the second year of their relief program, and raise funds for those in need in Iowa.

QCAIR recently joined the Quad Cities Sanctuary Coalition to support immigrant and refugees in need of sanctuary. In August we sponsored an asylum seeker released from a detention center; so far, she has applied for a work permit, and is eager to become a productive member of the community. We are in the process of raising funds to sponsor another asylum seeker/family. We welcome all immigrants and refugees, and we'll help them establish in our community one at a time.

Trees Forever

Trees Forever has been at the forefront of both major crises that have impacted Eastern Iowa in 2020. While COVID-19 has left many feeling isolated and cooped up at home, we have worked to update our volunteer process to allow safe opportunities for outdoor, socially-distanced tree plantings.

These volunteer opportunities have been a lifeline for those missing the community spirit that comes with working together and experiencing nature. Being outside amongst the trees is a great way to alleviate the added stress of the COVID-19 era.

Unfortunately, for residents of derecho-impacted communities, the outdoor spaces they once loved are now unrecognizable due to the widespread tree loss. Trees Forever has helped communities replant after many natural disasters. We pledge to do the same after this storm. Trees Forever has launched the "Planting Hope" campaign to restore the tree canopy lost on August 10.
